# New Holland

## Quick Facts

---

- The 2000 population stands at 318. This has decreased since 1990 by 3.6%.
- People in the 65 years or older category represent 18.9% of the total population, while the 0-17 age category represents 28.3% of the population in 2000
- According to the 2000 Census, persons of the Hispanic or Latino origin represent 0.0% of the population, while 12.3% of the total population is of Hispanic or Latino origin in the state of Illinois.
- The total number of households decreased by 6.7% between 1990 and 2000. There were 126 households in 2000.
- The number of female-headed households with children under 18 has decreased by 70% between 1990 and 2000.
- The proportion of individuals that have at least a high school education has increased between 1990 and 2000, from 80.2% to 86.0%. The proportion of individuals with a Bachelor's Degree or better has increased from 13.5% to 16.4%, during that same time period.
- In 2000, 12.4% of employment was in manufacturing while 40.7% was in the service sector, while the State of Illinois had 16.0% employed in manufacturing and 49.3% employed in the service sector.
- The median household income was \$40,278 in 1999 (2000 Census), while median household income for the state of Illinois was \$46,590.
- 10.8% of the population was below the poverty level of income in 2000. The state's comparable figure was 10.7%.
- The proportion of elderly in poverty declined between 1990 and 2000, from 11.9% to 4.5%.
- The proportion of youth (age 0 - 17) in poverty has increased between 1990 and 2000, from 12.4% to 22.7%.
