Workforce Availability Information is published annually by the Economic Information & Analysis Division of the Illinois Department of Employment Security. The reports are designed specifically in accordance with Federal guidelines to assist employers in evaluating their utilization of women and minority workers for their Affirmative Action plans. The geographic boundaries that determine the available labor pool depend to some extent on the specific occupation. The labor pool occupations may be limited to the local labor areas, the entire state or even the nation. To provide information appropriate to the circumstances, **Workforce Availability Information**, is available for the State of Illinois, Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs), and individual counties of the state. Technical Definitions

LABOR FORCE All persons, 16 years of age or older, who are either employed or unemployed.

EMPLOYED All persons who have a job, whether full- or part-time.

UNEMPLOYED All persons who do not have a job, but are able, available, and looking for work.
